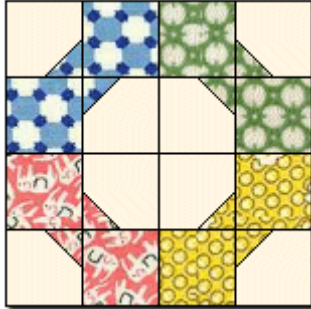


## August Quilt Block – to be in the September drawing

*Remember, the more blocks you bring, the more times your name goes in the drawing.*



This makes a 12" block!

This is a fabulous block for scrappy 30s reproduction fabrics. Whoever wins this set of blocks will have a cute, antique looking quilt.

### Supplies List



Color 1 needs: one 3- 1/2" x 7" strip AND one 2 " x 4" strip

Color 2 needs: one 3- 1/2" x 7" strip AND one 2 " x 4" strip

Color 3 needs: one 3- 1/2" x 7" strip AND one 2 " x 4" strip

Color 4 needs: one 3- 1/2" x 7" strip AND one 2 " x 4" strip

Color 5 needs: one strip 3- 1/2" x 28"

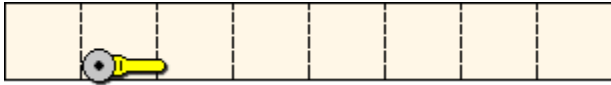
### Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block

First cut the Color 1 3-1/2" x 7" strip into two 3-1/2" squares. Repeat this step with Colors 2, 3 and 4...

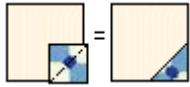


Now cut the Color 1 2" x 4" strip into two 2" squares. Repeat this step with Colors 2, 3 and 4...

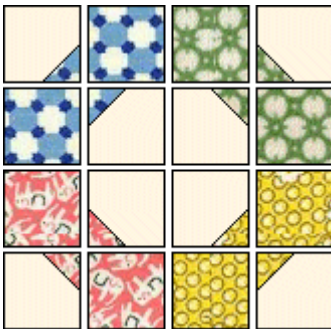

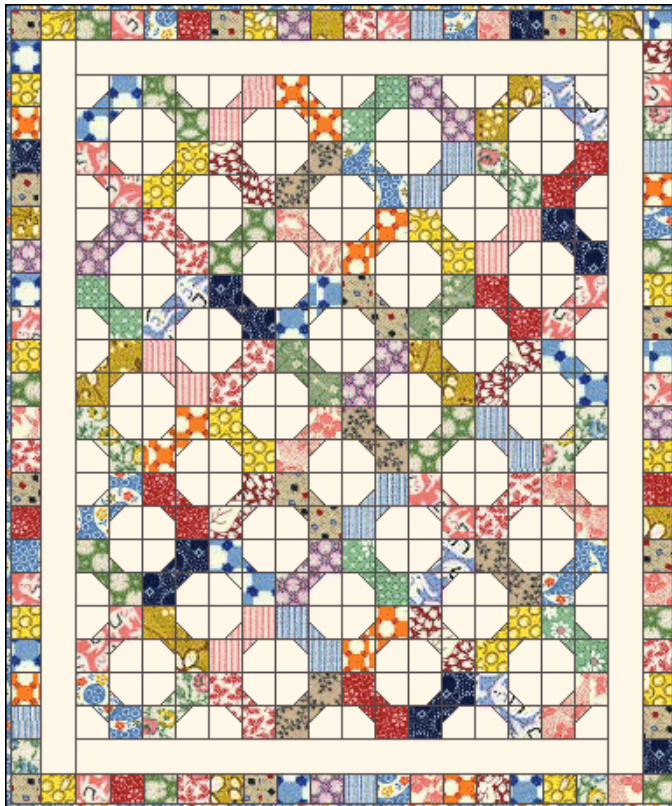
Then cut the Color 5 3-1/2" x 28" strip into eight 3-1/2" squares...



Next place a small Color 1 square atop a Color 5 3-1/2" square, right sides together, and edges lined up with one corner of the Color 5 square. On the back of the top small square lightly draw the diagonal, and sew ON this marked line. Cut off the excess seam allowance, and press the remainder towards the darker fabric. Make two units like this for Colors 1, 2, 3 and 4...



Now piece the block in the order shown at left. Alternate pressing directions as you add squares, and also as you add rows when sewing the rows together! All your seams should be 1/4" seams!



This quilt is made of four blocks by 5 blocks, surrounded by a three inch border of Color 5, then another border made up of random calicoes, and a binding in a random calico.
