

## June Quilt Blocks – to be in the July drawing

### Block Size: 12 ½” Unfinished

Fabric Colors: Two different teal, aqua, blue-green prints with any white or white on white fabric

These quilt blocks are constructed with half-square triangles.

You might want to make your 3 ½” half-square triangles with 4” squares of fabric and trim them down to the exact size. Use whatever system that works best for you.

These instructions are created using Quilt-Pro Systems Triangle Magic: Half-Square Triangle papers.

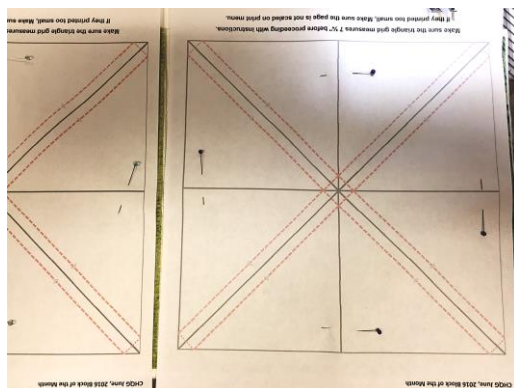


Instructions:

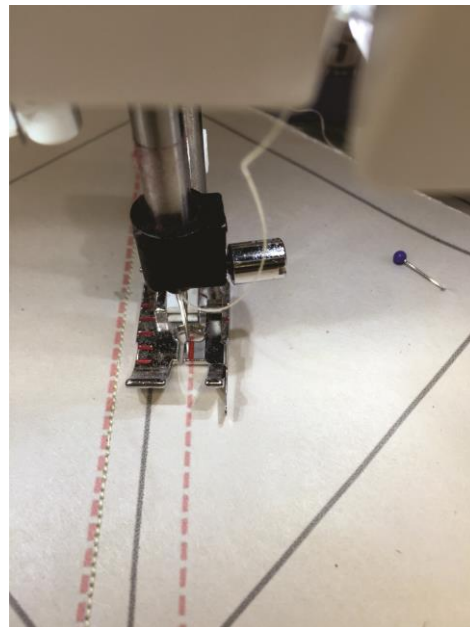
1. Cut one 8 ½” square of the first color print.
2. Cut one 8 ½” square of the second color print.
3. Cut two 8 ½” squares of white fabric.
4. Match one color and one white square, right sides together.

**NOTE: If printing or copying these triangle papers, make sure the triangle grid measures 7 ¾” before proceeding with instructions. If they print too small, Make sure the page is not scaled on print menu.**

5. Pin triangle paper to the matched squares (do not place pins on the dashed, sewing lines).



6. Using small stitches sew on ALL dashed lines. -----  
(NOTE: My first half-square triangles were a teensy bit small, so I stitched just a bit to the side of the dashed line to make sure my squares were not too small.)



7. After sewing all lines, use a ruler, rotary cutter and mat: carefully cut on the ALL solid lines —————. There will be 16 half-square triangle units for the block.



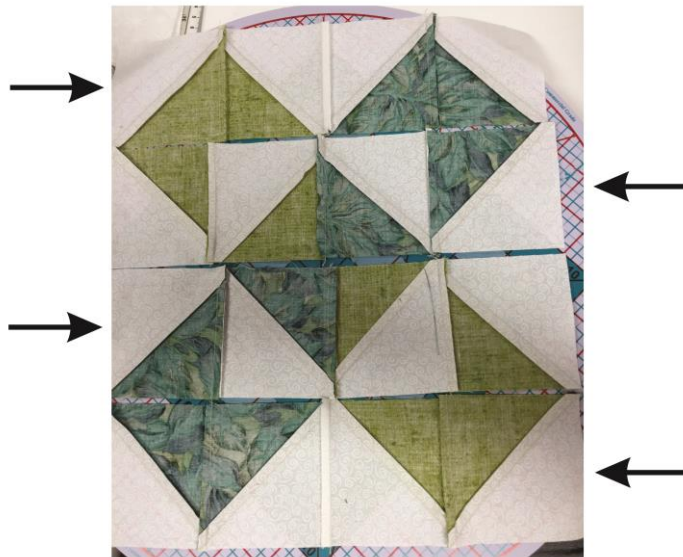
8. To tear the paper off: fold and crease the paper along the stitches. Pinch fabric close to the center of the seam and tear off paper. (Do not pull paper off starting at the corner; this can pull the seam out.)



9. Press seams toward the dark fabric.  
10. Cut dog ears off and square up unit if needed. Double check your measurements as you go to make sure you have 3 1/2" blocks before proceeding with assembly. (If your

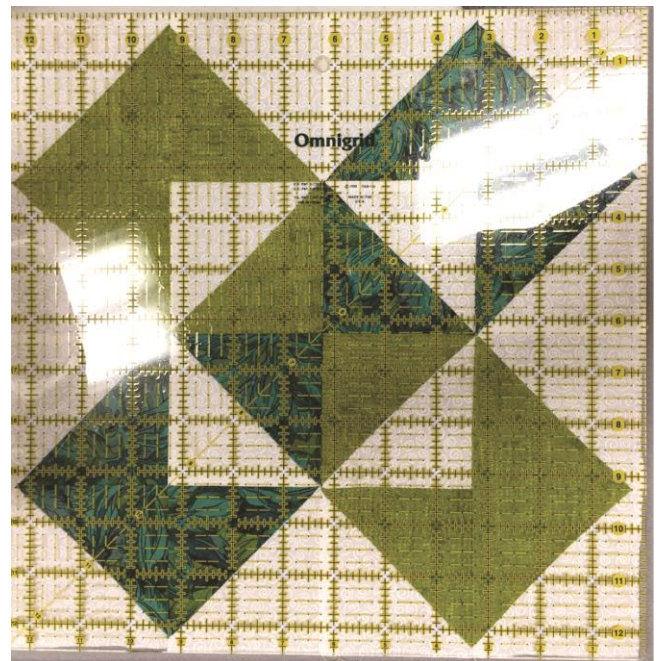
*blocks are a tiny bit small, you can just make your seams a scant 1/4" to make the final block come out to the correct size.)*

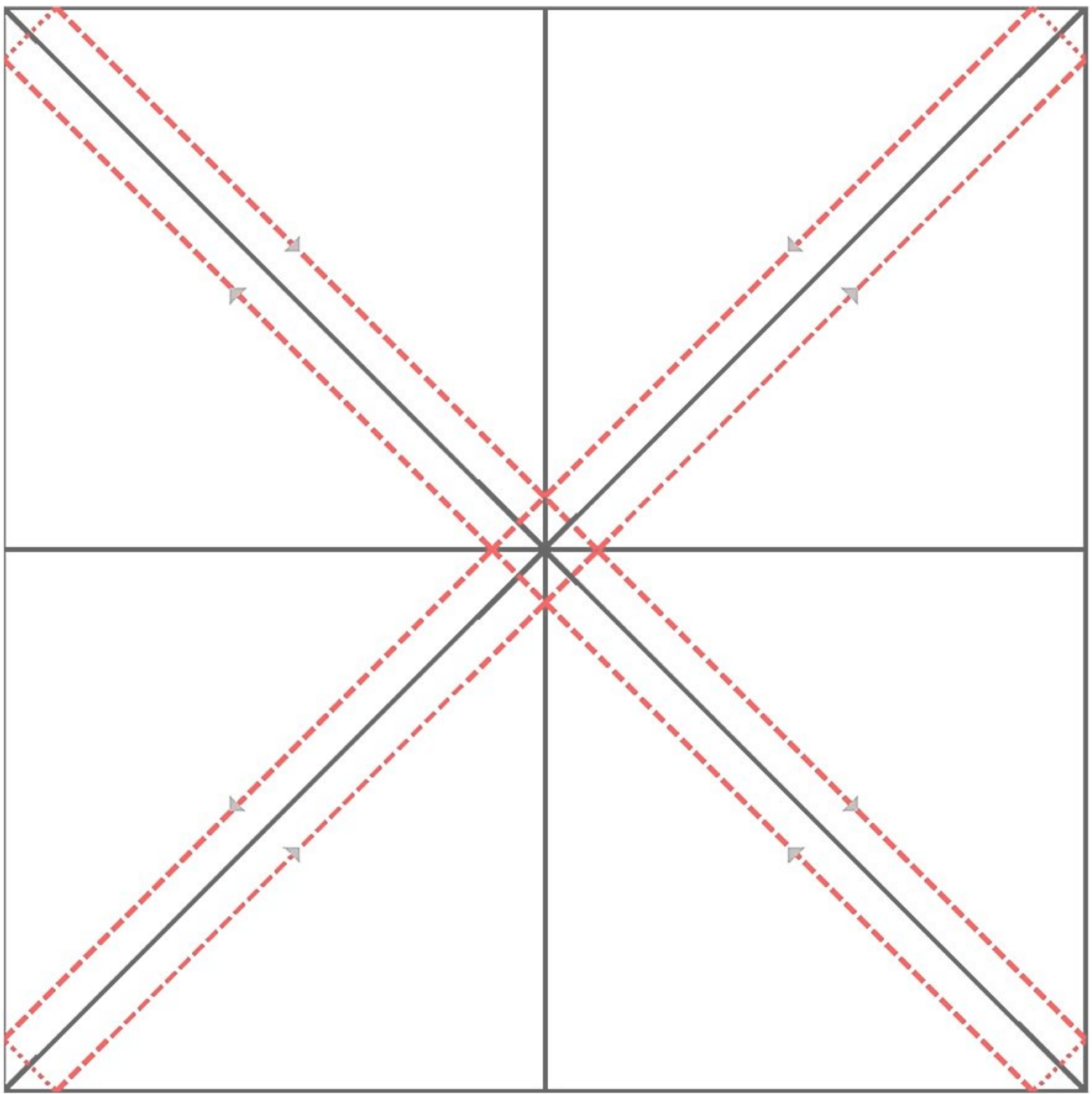
11. Arrange half-square triangle units on a surface according to the picture of the finished block. Using an accurate 1/4" seam, sew the four rows and press seams in the direction indicated by the arrows.



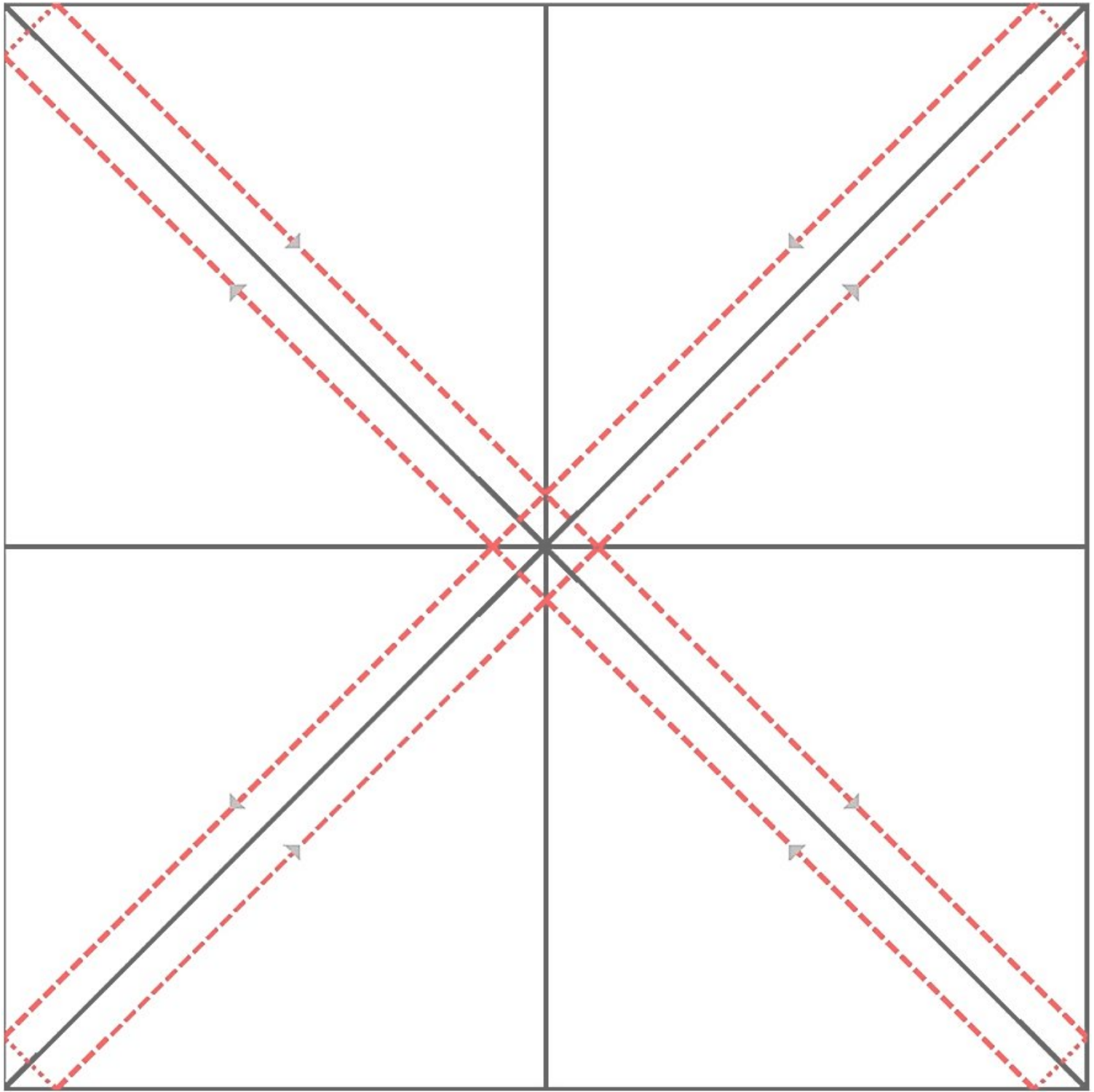
12. Sew the four rows together. Press the three seams in the same direction.
13. Block should measure 12 1/2" square. Please measure block and adjust seams, if necessary.
