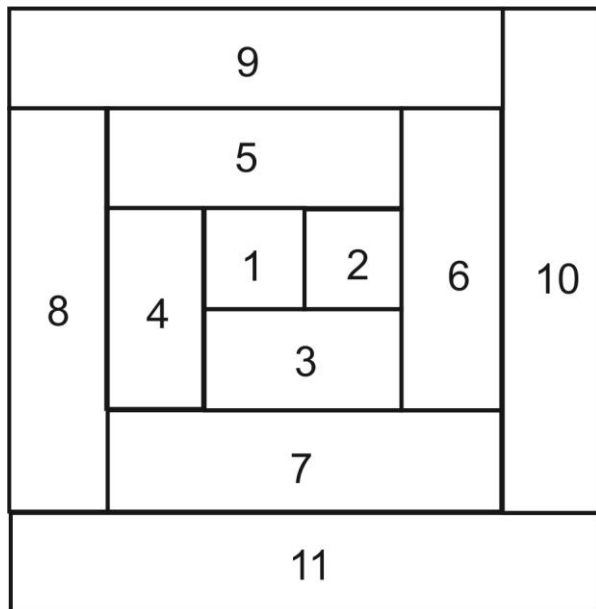


March Quilt Block – to be in the April drawing

Remember, the more blocks you bring, the more times your name goes in the drawing.

Log Cabin

This block is scrappy with the darker fabrics on one side and the lighter fabrics on the other side. Red blocks in the center are kind of traditional, to symbolize the hearth of the home. For this exchange, use any bright, warm color you wish for the center block.



Cutting instructions:

Center square: Block 1 - $2\frac{1}{2} \times 2\frac{1}{2}$ square

Dark fabrics:

Block 2 - $2\frac{1}{2} \times 2\frac{1}{2}$ square

Block 3 - $2\frac{1}{2} \times 4\frac{1}{2}$ strip

Block 6 - $2\frac{1}{2} \times 6\frac{1}{2}$ strip

Block 7 - $2\frac{1}{2} \times 8\frac{1}{2}$ strip

Block 10 - $2\frac{1}{2} \times 10\frac{1}{2}$ strip

Block 11 - $2\frac{1}{2} \times 12\frac{1}{2}$ strip

Light fabrics:

Block 4 - $2\frac{1}{2} \times 4\frac{1}{2}$ strip

Block 5 - $2\frac{1}{2} \times 6\frac{1}{2}$ strip

Block 8 - $2\frac{1}{2} \times 8\frac{1}{2}$ strip

Block 9 - $2\frac{1}{2} \times 10\frac{1}{2}$ strip

Your block will be square and true to size if you cut the strips to length before assembling the block. If you sew the strips onto the previous block and then trim to square it up, the block is apt to growing bigger or smaller as you go.

Press each seam away from the center as you assemble the blocks in the order of the diagram.
